RESOLUTION REGARDING THE FOURTH DEGREE COLOR CORPS BECOMING A RECOGNIZED PART OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH OFFICIAL LITURGY.

WHEREAS, the Fourth Degree Color Corps of the Knights of Columbus has acted as unofficial escorts to Bishops and Other high officials of the Catholic Church; and

WHEREAS, in this capacity they have participated in confirmations, Catholic mass and other ceremonies and have added solemnity and dignity to the occasion; and

WHEREAS, the Fourth Degree Color Corps is the most recognizable group within the Knights of Columbus, an Organization of dedicated Catholic men; and

WHEREAS, this participation is not officially recognized in the official liturgy of the Catholic Church; and

WHEREAS, this lack of official recognition has led to some confusion regarding their participation in these official catholic functions;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Supreme Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus respectfully request of the Council of Bishops of the United States that the Fourth Degree Color Corps be added to the official liturgy of the Catholic Church and their participation be officially acknowledged.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District Secretary forward this resolution to the Vied Supreme Master after approval, for forwarding to the Supreme Master and subsequently to the Supreme Secretary for action by the Supreme Council.
