Color Corps

In the past month the Color Corps was requested for three parish new Pastor installations in which Bishop Soto presided at all of them:

There was Color Corps at the first two installation ceremonies only. On each occasion, there was insufficient notification given to me to properly provide enough Color Corps for each ceremony. In fact, the St. Mary's installation ceremony had no Color Corps due to too short notification give to me to provide Color there. All three of these activities had plenty of communication to each parish that could have been forwarded to me. There was no valid reason why I wasn't given proper notification for our Color Corps team to be there for the Bishop. Sunday mornings are dedicated to all Sir Knights and their families to attend their own parishes for Sunday Mass. Most, if not all, Sir Knights are involved in a Sunday parish ministry (lector, Eucharistic minister, usher, collector, etc) and for a Sir Knight Color Corps member to find a substitute for a Sunday morning Color Corps activity requires proper and courteous notification from me to them. In the future, for any scheduled parish activity requesting our Color Corps

members, I require, at minimum, a 30 day notification. Extenuating circumstances can possibly alter this time period requirement; however, I expect proper notification courtesy for all future Color Corps events at our local parishes.
